### JOB PURPOSE:

The part-time post is designed for highly-motivated and enthusiastic individuals who are engaged in architectural practice. The successful applicant will join the School's team in delivering professionally accredited courses in architecture by contributing to the teaching of architecture design studio, professional skills and/or environment and technology in architecture, within the BSc Architecture (Part I) and/or Masters of Architecture (Part II) programmes. Working within a team, they will be expected to engage significantly with the teaching and organisation of architecture modules within the school : conducting tutorials, delivering lectures, leading seminars and participating in assessment and other teaching activities as required.

All teaching and administrative duties will be executed as appropriate to the part-time (Education only) post (0.5 FTE).

### MAJOR DUTIES:

#### Teaching:

- Deliver teaching and assessment activities associated with architectural design studio, professional skills and/or environment and technology modules including:
  - Deliver lectures, design tutorials and seminars.
  - Deliver design and representation skills seminars involving manual and digital techniques, model-making and 3D visualisations
  - Contribute to other taught modules within architecture if desired.
  - Participate in the assessment of design portfolios and outputs from other architectural modules as required.
  - Participate as part of a team in realising the end of year exhibition and preparations for external examiners' visits.
  - Help to develop appropriate teaching approaches and contribute to curriculum development.
  - Plan and develop independent teaching contributions and contribute to the design or revision of the programmes.

#### Administration/Contribution to the Community:

- Contribute substantively to the marketing of architecture at Queen's and the recruitment of students.
- Contribute to the School's outreach strategy by developing external links within the architecture profession in Northern Ireland and further afield.
- Provide pastoral care for students within own area to ensure that all issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic and effective manner.

#### Planning and Organising:

- Plan and manage own teaching and tutorials as agreed with Head of Discipline/mentor.
- Design/update modules in line with School's teaching strategy.

#### Resource Management Responsibilities:

- Use teaching and research resources, studios and workshops as required.

#### Internal and External Relationships:

- Collaborate with other staff within School.
- Involved in developing links or joining external networks to share information and ideas.

3. Experience in teaching architectural design studio and its attendant skills.
4. Ability to contribute to broader management and administrative processes.
5. High level of analytical capability.
6. Excellent design and visualisation skills.
7. Ability to communicate complex information clearly.
8. Excellent interpersonal skills.
9. Engagement in continuous professional development.
10. Ability to assess and organise resources.
