JOB PURPOSE:

The School of Social Sciences, Education and Social Work is seeking to appoint a Lecturer (Education) who will contribute to the delivery of a high quality postgraduate programme in Applied Behaviour Analysis for the period of 12 months (January 2020 to December 2020) and contribute to the School's outreach activity and teaching-related administration.

MAJOR DUTIES:

- 1. Engage in scholarly activity, for example through conference participation, applying for external funding and/or publication.
- 2. Develop networking links with relevant professional bodies to ensure that own teaching reflects current best practice in own area of subject specialism.
- 3. Maintain and develop teaching and subject expertise.

Teaching:

- Deliver a range of teaching and assessment activities in modules pertaining to the Master's in Applied Behaviour Analysis at postgraduate level, specifically co-ordinating two core MScABA postgraduate modules. Tasks include designing and delivering lectures, tutorials/seminars, setting/marking coursework, tutoring students through the University online platform (Canvas) and overseeing Teaching Assistants who contribute in the modules.
- 2. Select appropriate assessment instruments and criteria, assess the work and progress of students by reference to the criteria and provide constructive feedback to students.
- 3. Seek ways of improving performance by reflecting on teaching design and delivery and obtaining and analysing feedback.
- 4. Supervise postgraduate dissertations in the School.
- 5. Plan and develop independent teaching contributions across modules and contribute to the design or revision of course units. The post-holder will be expected to convene two core postgraduate modules pertaining to the MScABA (Concepts and Principles of Behaviour Analysis & Assessment in Behaviour Analysis), as well as contribute to other ABA postgraduate modules in the School as needed.
- 6. Help to develop appropriate teaching approaches and contribute to curriculum development.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

- 1. Contribute to the School's outreach strategy by developing external links.
- 2. Provide pastoral care for students within own area to ensure, as far as practicable, that relevant issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic and effective manner.
- 3. Carry out designated routine School administrative duties, including, for example, committee work, course administration, etc.
- 4. Be responsible for the record-keeping associated with teaching and the preparation of teaching materials.

Planning and Organising:

- 1. Plan and manage own teaching and tutorials as agreed with Head of School/mentor.
- 2. Modules are designed/updated in line with School's teaching strategy.

Resource Management Responsibilities:

1. Use teaching resources as required.

Internal and External Relationships:

- 1. Membership of the School Board and Examination Board and such committees relevant to their administrative duties.
- 2. Collaborate with other staff within School and in particular with the MScABA Director.
- 3. Become involved in developing links or joining external networks to share information and ideas.
- 4. Contribute to the School's outreach programme by establishing links with relevant external bodies.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- 1. Will have or be about to obtain a PhD in a relevant area of social science.
- 2. Be a Board Certified Behaviour Analyst (BCBA) or expect to sit and pass the BCBA exam within 3 months of appointment.
- 3. Teaching experience using a range of teaching methods.
- 4. Experience of marking written assignments.
- 5. Demonstrable ability to design course materials and to plan and organise the delivery and assessment of taught courses in own specialism.
- 6. Demonstrable ability to contribute to scholarly activity in a relevant area of social science.
- 7. Ability to contribute to broader management and administrative processes.
- 8. High level of analytical capability.
- 9. Ability to communicate complex information clearly.
- 10. Effective interpersonal skills to liaise with students and colleagues and work as part of a team.
- 11. Ability to encourage commitment to learn in others.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

- 1. Working towards PGCHET and/or membership of an appropriate professional and/or teaching body e.g. HEA.
- 2. Postgraduate degree in the discipline of Applied Behaviour Analysis.
- 3. Experience of teaching in the discipline of Applied Behaviour Analysis at university level or equivalent.
- 4. Experience of utilising online teaching methods
- 5. Research expertise relevant to the teaching of Applied Behaviour Analysis.
- 6. Ability to assess and organise resources.
