JOB PURPOSE:

To undertake research and provide research leadership in line with the School's research strategy, to teach at undergraduate and postgraduate level, and to contribute to School's administration/outreach activity.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

1. Oversee the development and review of teaching provision in Economics, particularly focussed on Macroeconomics, within the School.
2. Develop and teach courses or learning programmes for undergraduate and postgraduate students within the Economics degree courses, having overall responsibility for their design and quality. Provision of teaching within other courses as and when required.
3. Plan and review own teaching load and approach to teaching and coach others in doing the same.
4. Set and mark coursework, supervise and advise undergraduate and postgraduate research students and act as their internal and external examiner.
5. Act as internal examiner for undergraduate and postgraduate students.

Research:

1. Plan, establish and lead a research group in Macroeconomics of outstanding quality and national/international repute.
2. Sustain an extensive track record of published research findings by publishing in outstanding, international refereed journals and presenting at international conferences.
3. Lead major funding bids which develop and sustain research support for Economics in general and Macroeconomics in particular and advance the reputation of the School and the University in these research areas.
4. Develop strategies to attract both national and international research students
5. Provide supervision of part-time and full-time research students.
6. Direct, coach and develop research staff, where appropriate.
7. Ensure that research projects are completed on time and within budget.
8. Lead on developing opportunities for impact particularly in the area of macroeconomic policy and the media profile of the Economics group at QMS.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

1. May take responsibility for the appointment, development and management of all staff of all types in the directly managed team.
2. Should be willing to assume the role of Subject Leader of Economics in QMS.
3. Contribute to the running and strategic direction of the University through designated committee membership or project activities.
4. Contribute significantly to the development and running of the School by taking on appropriate School co-ordinating roles. Such duties may include, for example, Director of Research, QAA Aspect Co-ordinator, Module/Year/Programme Co-ordinator, or other recognised official University roles.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

1. PhD in Economics, or a related discipline.
2. Proven ability to plan and deliver a programme of research and to develop teaching programmes in economics.
3. Internationally recognised excellence and reputation in Macroeconomics, Applied Macroeconomics, Macroeconomic Policy and/or a related specialism.
4. Sustained publication record of international excellence in Macroeconomics.
5. Experience of supervising research students and/or postdoctoral researchers.
6. Record of securing external research funding.
7. Experience of teaching and assessment in Economics at University level.
8. Demonstrable ability to contribute to successful, sustained postgraduate student supervision as primary supervisor normally at PhD level.
9. Substantial experience of providing strategic academic leadership in research, teaching and programme development in Economics.
10. Contribution to a wider range of School administrative tasks at a more strategic level.
11. Vision on future research and development plans and how they would benefit the Economic subject group and the School.
12. Understanding of resource management processes and skills to apply them effectively.
13. Expertise in the area of Macroeconomics.
14. Ability to communicate complex information effectively.
15. Involvement in productive external collaboration, in particular with international partners.
16. Ability to provide effective leadership.
17. Evidence of leadership qualities.
18. Demonstrable ability to contribute to the School's internationalisation strategy and accreditation mission.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

1. Expertise in at least one of the following areas: Macroeconomics; applied macroeconomics; macroeconomic policy; public economics; international economics.
2. Ability to assume a leadership role in the development of a research group in Macroeconomics of outstanding quality and national/international repute.
3. Ability to develop REF impact cases in the area of macroeconomic policy making.
4. Ability to assume a leadership role in the development of the delivery and teaching of Macroeconomics in the Economics programmes at QMS.
5. Ability to contribute to executive education programmes.
6. Ability to assume the role of Subject Leader of Economics.
7. Evidence of a commitment to interdisciplinary research.
