JOB PURPOSE:

To undertake research and provide research leadership in line with the School's research strategy, to teach at undergraduate and postgraduate level, and to contribute to the School's administration/outreach activity, particularly in the area of Commercial Law broadly conceived including, but not limited to banking and finance law; corporate law including corporate finance; international sale of goods; private international law and arbitration; undertake research in line with the School's research strategy in Commercial Law broadly conceived; to teach at undergraduate and postgraduate level, and to contribute to School's administration/leadership activity.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

- 1. Provide high quality teaching in the area of Commercial Law within the School at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels (inclusive of LLM in International Commercial and Business Law).
- 2. Develop and teach courses or learning programmes for undergraduate and postgraduate students within the Law degree courses, having overall responsibility for their design and quality.
- 3. Provision of teaching within foundations of legal knowledge subjects as required.
- 4. Plan and review own teaching load and approach to teaching and coach others in doing the same.
- 5. Act as internal examiner for undergraduate and postgraduate students.

Research:

- 1. Develop and contribute to the research strategies of the School and maintain a reputation as an expert in own subject area.
- 2. Sustain an extensive track record of research publications in Commercial Law broadly conceived, publishing in refereed journals/ with leading publishers and presenting at national/international conferences.
- 3. Develop innovative research proposals and lead funding bids.
- 4. Direct, mentor and develop research staff, where appropriate.
- 5. Ensure that research projects are completed on time and within budget.
- 6. Act as referee and contribute to peer assessment of research.
- 7. Provide supervision of part-time and full-time research students.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

- 1. Contribute significantly (commensurate with grade of appointment) to the development and running of the School by taking on appropriate School leadership roles.
- 2. Act as mentor or appraiser to colleagues, including Teaching Assistants, advising on their personal development and ensuring that that they are meeting the standards required.
- 3. Provide pastoral care for students within own area to ensure, as far as practicable, that relevant issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic and effective manner.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- A first degree in Law or another qualification which includes subjects that equate to the Foundations of Legal Knowledge.
- 2. A PhD in Law or other relevant subject.
- 3. Sustained publication record of at least international excellence in the area of Commercial Law broadly conceived.
- 4. Record of securing external research funding as appropriate to subject area and/or demonstrable ability to secure the same.

- 5. Sustained record of dissemination, commensurate with stage of career, nationally and internationally.
- 6. Ability to strengthen the School's national and international research networks.
- 7. Substantial experience of teaching and assessment at undergraduate and postgraduate level in Commercial Law broadly conceived such as, but not limited to, banking and finance law; corporate law including corporate finance; international sale of goods; private international law and arbitration.
- 8. Ability to contribute to the School's LLMs particularly the LLM in International Commercial and Business Law.
- 9. Ability to contribute to teaching within the foundations of legal knowledge subjects.
- 10. Demonstrate the ability to deliver excellent teaching.
- 11. Contribution to a wider range of administrative and leadership tasks at a more strategic level.
- 12. Willingness and ability to contribute to the management of the School in general.
- 13. Demonstrate evidence of ability to communicate complex information clearly and effectively.
- 14. Ability to provide effective leadership.
- 15. Evidence of good interpersonal skills and the ability to work both independently and as part of a team.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

- 1. Sustained contribution to Commercial Law academic community, evidenced by means of peer-reviews for specialist journals, membership of editorial boards of specialist journals, longstanding membership learned societies (or such sections of generalists learned societies).
