### JOB PURPOSE:

To support the Mitchell Institute Director in providing strategic leadership and management of the Institute. To undertake research and to provide research supervision and leadership, and research-based graduate teaching, as agreed with the Director.

### MAJOR DUTIES:

#### Research:

1. The position will be at Chair level, with the appointee simultaneously being a Professor in the relevant QUB School. The Deputy Director will be expected to maintain a record of:
  - World-class research and publication in the field of peace, security and justice.
  - Graduate supervision (including PGR students).
  - Involvement in research-funding bids, as appropriate to field.

#### Administration/Contribution to the Community:

1. The Deputy Director will support the Director in providing strategic leadership and management of the Institute. This work will include:
  - Sustaining and developing the Institute's research, educational and societally-facing work.
  - Deputising for the Director as required.
  - Contributing as an active member of the Institute's leadership team, including a role in the Institute's ongoing research, research supervision and acquisition of major research grant funding.

#### Internal and External Relationships:

1. The Deputy Director will contribute to the development and sustenance of interdisciplinary networks within and beyond QUB, including networks with leading international scholars and universities.

### ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

1. PhD in any discipline, with clear relevance for peace, security and justice.
2. Sustained record of research publications of the highest international quality and with the most prestigious publishers/journals.
3. Sustained record of successful graduate student (including PGR student) supervision.
4. Sustained record of securing external research funding as appropriate to field and discipline.
5. Evidence of capacity and willingness to contribute to the creation and sustenance of high-quality, interdisciplinary networks (locally, nationally, internationally).
6. Evidence of a very detailed knowledge of the work of the Mitchell Institute, and of sustained and successful managerial work in this or a similar Research Institute.
7. Demonstrable record of communicating effectively, working collegially, and engaging successfully in the leadership and management of colleagues.
