JOB PURPOSE:

To undertake research and to provide research supervision and leadership, and research-based graduate teaching, in line with the Mitchell Institute's research, educational and societally-facing work, in the field of Women, Peace, Security and Justice.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

1. Provide PGT teaching and supervision in the field of Women, Peace, Security and Justice, as agreed with the Institute Director.

Research

- 1. Conduct demonstrably world-class research and publication in the field of women, peace, security and justice.
- 2. Attract and supervise national and international graduate students, including PGR students.
- 3. Mentor and develop Institute colleagues, as appropriate to field.
- 4. Lead major research-funding bids, and attract research funding, as appropriate to field.
- 5. Bring, develop and lead national and international research networks in appropriate field, as part of the Institute's ongoing work.
- 6. Play a leading role in the Institute's contribution to the work of the relevant School and Faculty, as agreed with the Mitchell Institute Director.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

1. Contribute to the running and strategic direction of the Institute, as agreed with the Institute Director.

Internal and External Relationships:

1. Contribute significantly to the creation and sustenance of interdisciplinary networks within and beyond QUB, including networks with leading international scholars and universities.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- 1. PhD in any discipline, with clear relevance for women, peace, security and justice.
- 2. Sustained record of research publications of the highest international quality and with the most prestigious publishers/journals.
- 3. Distinguished research reputation, as evidenced by indicators such as the winning of research-related prizes, and election to the Fellowship of National Academies (eg the British Academy, the Royal Irish Academy).
- 4. Sustained record of successful PhD supervision.
- 5. Sustained record of securing external research funding as appropriate to field and discipline.
- 6. Experience of successful and sustained teaching at PGT level.
- 7. Evidence of capacity and willingness to contribute to the creation and successful sustenance of high-quality, interdisciplinary networks (locally, nationally, internationally).
- 8. Demonstrable record of communicating effectively and working collegially.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

1. Election to the Fellowship of more than one National Academy.
