JOB PURPOSE:

Architecture at Queen's University Belfast has a very strong reputation for Architectural Education at both national and international level. To maintain and further strengthen that position, we are now recruiting a part-time Lecturer into Architecture who will join a dedicated team in the School of the Natural & Built Environment. This part-time position (equating to 2 days per week) will be for twelve months to cover a period of Maternity Leave.

The successful applicant will assist in delivering professionally accredited Modules in both Design Studio and Technology & Environment at undergraduate level and Professional Skills at postgraduate level. This assistance will involve coordinating modules alongside working with colleagues, to deliver lectures, leading seminars, conducting tutorials and participating in a range of teaching activities.

The successful candidate must be available to start in September 2023.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

1. Teach Architectural Design and Architectural Skills at undergraduate level, informed by a thorough knowledge of technology and sustainability.
2. Teach Technology & Environment at undergraduate level, informed by a thorough knowledge of best practice.
3. Assist in Teaching Professional Skills at postgraduate level.
4. Select appropriate assessment instruments and criteria, assess the work and progress of students accordingly and provide constructive feedback.
5. Seek ways of improving performance by reflecting on teaching design and delivery and obtaining and analysing feedback.
6. Help to develop appropriate teaching approaches and contribute to curriculum development.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

1. Carry out administrative duties associated with any coordination and teaching commitments, including assessment.
2. Provide pastoral care for students within own area to ensure that all issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic and effective manner.
3. Be responsible for the record-keeping associated with teaching and the preparation of teaching materials.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

1. M.Arch (Distinction or Commendation) in an accredited ARB/RIBA Part II (or equivalent) programme; and degree in Architecture from an accredited ARB/RIBA Part 1 (or equivalent) programme).
2. Experience in contributing to teaching inputs to deliver an integrated design education to undergraduate architecture students to achieve Part I ARB professional accreditation.

 - Demonstrable experience in delivery of design studio teaching, including the necessary research and delivery of project briefs, scheduling of inputs, providing tutorials, lectures and workshops as necessary.
 - Demonstrable experience in delivery of design skills including support for representation and communication.
 - Demonstrate experience in delivery of Technology & Environment including the necessary teaching, research and delivery of project briefs, scheduling of inputs, providing tutorials, lectures and workshops as necessary.
4. Demonstrable commitment in being an effective team member and in wanting to contribute to society.
5. Demonstrable experience in providing pastoral care to students at undergraduate level.
6. Proven ability in effective team working.
7. Proven ability to engage in critical discussion about current issues in architectural design and education.
8. Proven ability to present ideas clearly and succinctly.
