JOB PURPOSE:

To deliver effective teaching and learning on bespoke writing and cultural modules for inbound study abroad cohorts at undergraduate level, and to contribute to the School's/area's administration/outreach and global mobility activity.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

- 1. Deliver a range of teaching and assessment activities in writing in English and in cultural immersion modules relevant to Belfast/the north of Ireland, including lectures, seminars, and setting/marking.
- 2. Select appropriate assessment instruments and criteria, assess the work and progress of students by reference to the criteria and provide constructive and timely feedback to students.
- 3. Seek ways of improving performance by reflecting on teaching design and delivery and obtaining and analysing feedback.
- 4. Delivering high-quality teaching to study abroad student cohorts.
- 5. Plan and develop independent teaching contributions and contribute to the design or revision of programme structure and modules.
- 6. Help to develop appropriate teaching approaches and contribute to curriculum development.
- 7. Contribute to winter and summer school planning and delivery.
- 8. Teaching experience at tertiary level appropriate to stage of career.

Research:

- 1. Engage in scholarly activity, such as publications and conference activities in relevant research area.
- 2. Develop networking links with relevant professional bodies and the wider academic field to ensure that own teaching reflects current best practice in own area of subject specialism.
- 3. Maintain and develop teaching and subject expertise in the area.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

- 1. Provide pastoral care for students within own area to ensure, as far as practicable, that relevant issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic, and effective manner.
- 2. Carry out designated routine School administrative duties, including, for example, committee work, course administration, etc.
- 3. Be responsible for the record–keeping associated with teaching and the preparation of teaching materials.
- 4. Provide overall academic management of bespoke study abroad modules within the School/Faculty as required.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- 1. Must have or be about to obtain a PhD in English (Language, Literature, or Creative Writing).
- 2. Evidence of publications and research activities relevant to stage of career.
- 3. Experience in the delivery of lectures and seminars in a related or relevant area to English composition courses.
- 4. Ability to design course materials and to plan and organise the delivery and assessment of taught courses.
- 5. Ability to contribute to broader management and administrative processes.
- 6. Must demonstrate good reasoning ability and balanced judgement.
- 7. Willingness to undertake teaching and other relevant activities outside normal working hours.

- 8. Ability to communicate complex information clearly.
- 9. Effective interpersonal skills.
- 10. Engagement in continuous professional development.
- 11. Ability to assess and organise resources.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

- 1. To facilitate development of the School and Faculty's study abroad ambitions, experience of dedicated study abroad engagement would be beneficial.
- 2. Experience of delivery of cultural immersion activities for study abroad students.
- 3. Experience of international student support.
- 4. Successful grant capture relevant to stage of career.
- 5. Experience of programme management and related roles, e.g. Subject Lead, Advisor of Studies, relevant committee activity.
- 6. PGCHET and/or membership of an appropriate professional and/or teaching body e.g., HEA.
