JOB PURPOSE:

The purpose of this job is to assist in research activities related to the ongoing NIHR CHOICE trial and HEE Dental RECUR Brief Negotiated Interview (DR-BNI) work1. The aim of the CHOICE trial is to evaluate the effectiveness and cost-effectiveness in NHS primary care of a novel intervention (Dental RECUR – Brief Negotiated Interview) and usual care versus usual care alone, to prevent dental caries in children. The HEE work involves scaling up the DR-BNI for improving oral health in children nationally. The successful candidate will work alongside Professor Pauline Adair, Dr Marc Edwards, as well as the wider research team.

MAJOR DUTIES:

- 1. To assist in the transcribing and fidelity monitoring of DR-BNI intervention recordings.
- 2. To assist in the delivery, transcribing, and analysis of focus group interviews as part of the process evaluation.
- 3. To assist in the study within a trial (SWAT) and school outreach for recruitment of participants.
- 4. To assist in the scaling up of the DR-BNI intervention for improving oral health in children nationally, including preparation of training materials for learning platform delivery and organising and delivering a hands-on workshop for international feedback using a nominal group technique.
- 5. Produce high quality research outputs consistent with project aims and commensurate with career stage. This will include collaborating and co-authoring with PI and project team (as appropriate) on outputs.
- 6. In consultation with the project team, promote research milestones and outputs at national and international conferences and high quality papers in peer reviewed journals.
- 7. Assist grant holder in the preparation of funding proposals and applications to external bodies.
- 8. Carry out occasional educational supervision, demonstrating or lecturing duties within the post holder's area of expertise and under the direct guidance of a member of academic staff.
- 9. Undertake supplementary duties relevant to the success of the project including administrative duties and additional training and development activities as required.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- 1. A degree (UG or MSc) in psychology or very closely related subject.
- 2. Relevant experience to include:
 - Experience in applied psychology research and the application of quantitative and qualitative data analysis.
 - Experience working in applied psychology and health behaviour change.
 - Experience handling qualitative data/transcribing interviews.
- 3. Demonstrable attention to detail and accuracy in handling data.
- 4. Demonstrable awareness of good clinical practice principles (e.g., compliance with study protocol, confidentiality).
- 5. Knowledge of fidelity monitoring and implementation processes in clinical trials.
- 6. Willingness to undertake additional training in research methods and other related skills as required.
- 7. Practical problem-solving skills, independence of thought and initiative.
- 8. Ability to confidently communicate complex information effectively in oral and written format.
- 9. Ability to build relationships to develop internal and external networks.
- 10. Ability to assess and organise resources.

11. Willingness to travel to meet the requirements of the research project.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

- 1. Working towards a PhD in the area of applied or health psychology.
- 2. A publication record which is commensurate with career stage and experience.
- 3. Previous experience in oral health research projects that deliver against targets and timelines, preferably within an interdisciplinary environment.
- 4. Familiarity with governance and ethical issues related to NHS research.
- 5. Interest in health psychology research.
- 6. Application of SMART goals for health behaviour change
- 7. Knowledge of motivational interviewing and behaviour change techniques.
