JOB PURPOSE:

To undertake research in line with the School's research strategy, to teach at undergraduate and postgraduate level, and to contribute to the School's administration/outreach activity, particularly in Law and Technology including the law relating to cryptocurrency, cybersecurity, new forms of commerce, the platform economy, smart cities, and the virtual environment.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

- 1. Provide high quality teaching in the area of Law and Technology within the School at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels including on the School's core modules on its LLB programmes.
- 2. Develop modules, courses or learning programmes for undergraduate and postgraduate students within the Law degree courses in the School as required.
- 3. Plan, reflect on and review own approach to teaching taking into account feedback with a view to enhancing the quality of learning opportunities and the student experience.
- 4. Design formative and summative assessments and act as internal examiner for undergraduate and postgraduate students.
- 5. Supervise undergraduate and postgraduate dissertations.

Research:

- 1. Develop and contribute to the research strategies of the School in the field of Law and Technology and maintain a reputation as an expert in own subject area.
- 2. Evidence of ability to produce high quality publications at an international level of excellence in Law and Technology, publishing in refereed journals/ with leading publishers and presenting at national/international conferences/workshops.
- 3. Evidence of ability to develop innovative research proposals and lead funding bids.
- 4. Provide supervision of part-time and full-time research students.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

- 1. Contribute to the School administration by taking on appropriate School roles as requested by the Head of School.
- 2. Act as mentor or appraiser to colleagues, including Teaching Assistants, advising on their personal development and ensuring that that they are meeting the standards required.
