JOB PURPOSE:

To work with the Stress Trauma and Related Conditions (STARC) research centre and a productive team of researchers working in the field of psychological trauma and mental health. The post holder will be responsible for the management of data administration and preparation for a case-control study of psychological risk and resilience factors for traumatic stress in Colombia. They will conduct research across a broad array of research topics pertaining to psychological trauma and mental health. They will contribute to the creation of peer-reviewed outputs, presentations, and academic reports.

MAJOR DUTIES:

- 1. Day to day responsibility for the management and administration of an established research study.
- 2. Regular liaison with the PI concerning updates on project progress; flagging up problems as they arise.
- 3. Be the key liaison for internal and external collaborators as directed by the project and by the PI.
- 4. Ensure the best possible response rates for research participation within the designated timeframe.
- 5. Be involved in the collection of data and working flexibly based on project demands.
- 6. Oversee the management and preparation of research data for analysis.
- 7. Be involved in the analysis and writing up of academic products, including project reports and submissions to peer-review journals.
- 8. Prepare presentations and attend and present at relevant meetings and seminars as required.
- 9. Where appropriate to the project, collate, screen, clean and oversee the management of quantitative data.
- 10. Assist the PI in identifying and writing funding applications to support research activity.
- 11. Travel in-line with the requirements of the post.
- 12. Read academic papers, journals and textbooks to keep abreast of developments in own specialism and related disciplines.
- 13. Any other duties appropriate to the grade and nature of the post.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

- 1. Honours Degree in Psychology or related discipline.
- 2. A PhD in Psychology, Epidemiology, Statistics or related discipline.
- 3. Relevant disciplinary research experience.
- 4. Experience of having worked with multidisciplinary teams involved in research.
- 5. Project management experience, preferably in an academic setting.
- 6. Experience in preparation and management of quantitative research data.
- 7. A peer reviewed publication record commensurate with career stage.
- 8. Evidence of good organisational and administrative skills.
- 9. Ability to manage a collaborative research project.
- 10. Evidence of ability to engage and communicate effectively with a broad range of stakeholders (e.g., in academic, statutory, and non-statutory sectors).
- 11. Ability to communicate complex information clearly.
- 12. Ability to assess and organise resources.
- 13. Willingness to travel in line with the requirements of the post.
