JOB PURPOSE:

To teach at undergraduate and postgraduate level in the area of criminology, contribute to the School's administration as required and to develop or maintain a portfolio of appropriate scholarly activity.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Teaching:

1. Develop and deliver teaching and assessment at undergraduate and postgraduate level, including lectures, setting/marking coursework, and student supervision.
2. Deliver teaching on criminological theory and the criminology across borders module which examines issues, such as genocide, criminology of war, terrorism, transnational policy, criminalisation of migration and organised crime.
3. Take responsibility for the quality of modules delivered, including online and guidance materials necessary to deliver teaching.
4. Contribute to the development of a positive student experience.

Scholarly Activity:

1. Maintain and develop teaching and subject expertise.
2. Disseminate research by publishing and/or presenting at conferences in the field of criminology, as appropriate for stage of career.

Administration/Contribution to the Community:

1. Undertake personal tutoring with students to ensure, as far as practicable, that all relevant issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic and effective manner.
2. Carry out designated School functions, including, for example, assisting with recruitment events.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

1. Primary or higher degree in a relevant social science subject.
2. PhD or equivalent awarded or due for completion and to be awarded within one year of taking up post.
3. Evidence of an ability to disseminate research by publishing and/or presenting at criminology conferences commensurate with stage of career.
4. Experience of lecturing and tutoring at University level or equivalent in a relevant social science discipline.
5. Evidence of appropriate administrative experience, commensurate with stage of career.
6. Ability to communicate clearly and effectively to students, academic colleagues and professional bodies and managers.
7. Ability to work independently and collegially.

DESIRABLE CRITERIA:

1. Subject of PhD research directly relevant to the School's research themes.
2. Higher Education Academy membership (or equivalent HE teaching qualification).
3. Research interests directly relevant to Criminology.
4. Expertise in criminological theory, conflict, criminology of war, terrorism, transnational policy, criminalisation of migration and/or organised crime.

5. Ability to enhance existing research strengths in the School (e.g. youth crime, conflict, etc.) or contribute to existing teaching gaps in the School (e.g., criminology across borders or criminological theory).
6. Presentation of research at conferences, workshops or other events as appropriate for stage of career.
7. Sustained teaching experience at University level.
8. Evidence of good teaching evaluations.
9. Ability to supervise undergraduate dissertation projects.
10. Contributions to a range of administrative tasks.
11. Contribution to a wide range of community/outreach activities.
