### JOB PURPOSE:

This post is available immediately to teach at undergraduate level, and to contribute to the School's administration and outreach. Appointment will be at Lecturer level.

### MAJOR DUTIES:

#### Teaching:

1. Routinely communicate complex and conceptual ideas to students as well as to peers using high level skills and a range of media.
2. Develop the teaching activities of the School by pursuing effective teaching approaches taking responsibility for the quality of course units and delivering a range of teaching and assessment activities including lectures, setting/marking coursework, and practice learning according to the needs of the School's curricula.
3. Contribute to the enhancement of quality teaching within the subject, school, or faculty, ensuring that course design and delivery comply with the appropriate benchmarks, regulations and accreditation criteria.

#### Scholarly Activity:

1. Engage in scholarly activity e.g. participate in conferences, book reviews and/or prepare teaching/professional materials.
2. Maintain and develop teaching and subject expertise.
3. Where appropriate, develop proposals and prepare, in collaboration with others, funding bids for external contract work that might involve publishing materials for education.

#### Administration/Contribution to the Community:

1. Provide personal and academic tutoring to students within their own area and ensure, as far as practicable, that relevant issues are dealt with in a timely, appropriate and effective manner.
2. Contribute to the School's outreach strategy by engaging with community outreach programmes and developing external links.
3. Contribute to the development and running of the School/area by taking on appropriate School co-ordinating roles, in particular module coordination.
4. Participate in School, Faculty, and University administration as requested by line manager.

### ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:

1. Primary or higher degree in a social science subject.
2. Professional qualification in social work.
3. Eligible for and willingness to seek required registration as a social worker with the Northern Ireland Social Care Council.
4. Have substantial post qualifying experience following successful completion of Assessed Year in Employment or equivalent (which would be three years post qualifying experience).
5. Experience of lecturing and tutoring at University level or equivalent.
6. Experience in social work education and training.
7. Evidence of appropriate administrative experience, commensurate with stage of career.
8. Evidence of potential to contribute to broader management and administrative processes.

9. Evidence of ability to communicate clearly and effectively to students, academic colleagues and professional bodies and managers.
10. Evidence of good interpersonal skills and the ability to work both independently and as part of a team.

1. Qualified Practice Teacher.
2. Scholarship interests directly relevant to Social Work.
3. Ability to lecture to undergraduate students in areas of relevance to social work.
4. Evidence of student supervision.
