## JOB PURPOSE:

To be a highly productive, ambitious and collaborative member of our Deaf Studies/Sign Language research project assisting in the development of research proposals and the planning and delivery of research activity, particularly for projects that will have a direct benefit for the Northern Irish Deaf community.

The successful applicant will have responsibilities in independent research and outreach, as well as regular reporting to our funders and sponsors – the Department for Communities and the Ulster Society for the Education of the Deaf and Blind. Areas of particular interest to the project are:

- 1. Accessibility and Inclusion for d/Deaf students in Further and Higher Education.
- 2. To what extent and in what ways is poverty experienced by the d/Deaf community?
- 3. The d/Deaf community and ageing experiences of older d/Deaf people in Northern Ireland.
- 4. The identification of positive role models for young d/Deaf people.

Preference may therefore be given to applicants who have a demonstrable ability to undertake research and produce outputs in at least one of these areas.

## **MAJOR DUTIES:**

- 1. Develop and plan an area of personal research and expertise that offers benefits to the Northern Irish Deaf community.
- 2. Produce high quality research outputs consistent with project aims and commensurate with career stage. This may include collaborating and co-authoring with the project team (as appropriate) on outputs.
- 3. In consultation with the project team, promote research milestones and outputs at national and international conferences and through social media (where applicable).
- 4. Assist the project in the preparation of funding proposals and applications to external bodies.
- 5. Carry out occasional educational supervision, demonstrating or lecturing duties within the post holder's area of expertise and under the direct guidance of a member of academic staff.
- 6. Undertake supplementary duties relevant to the success of the project including administrative duties, reporting, and additional training and development activities as required.

## **ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:**

- 1. Must have a relevant PhD.
- 2. Must have at least Level 6 BSL, or the equivalent for ISL.
- 3. Recent relevant\* research experience to include:
  - Experience of research in the area relevant to this project.
  - Working effectively as part of a research team in the development and promotion of Deaf Studies.
  - Track record of publication and report writing, commensurate with stage.
- 4. Ability to contribute to broader management and administrative processes.
- 5. Contribute to the School's outreach programme by links with industry, community groups etc.
- 6. Willingness to undertake additional training in research methods and other related skills as required.

- 7. Practical problem-solving skills, independence of thought and initiative.
- 8. Ability to communicate complex information effectively in oral, written and signed formats.
- 9. Ability to build relationships to develop internal and external networks.
- 10. Ability to assess and organise resources.
