## JOB PURPOSE:

To make a significant contribution to the delivery of the human geography education in Geography/School of Natural and Built Environment, particularly in supporting the BA Geography and BSc Geography, as well as the MA Geopolitics and MSc Climate Change programmes.

To support the development and delivery of an innovative teaching and learning strategy in the School and contribute to the administration/outreach activity when required. In addition you may act as a supervisor for undergraduate and or MSc student research projects and assist in the delivery of human geography classes.

## **MAJOR DUTIES:**

## Teaching:

- 1. To deliver a range of teaching and assessment activities in human geography at undergraduate and postgraduate taught level.
- 2. To deliver tutorial content in support of the core curriculum of assigned modules.
- 3. To support computer-based teaching and assessment.
- 4. Provide supervision for undergraduate student research projects.
- 5. Assess the work and progress of students by reference to pre-defined criteria and provide constructive and timely feedback in line with School procedures to promote a high-quality student learning experience.
- 6. Continually assist the improvement of student performance and experience, specifically in the delivery of learning activities by obtaining and analysing feedback.
- 7. Maintenance and updating of content on a virtual learning environment for assigned modules.
- 8. Assist other members of staff as needed to support the School's teaching requirements.

### **Scholarly Activity:**

- 1. Develop links with relevant professional bodies to ensure that teaching reflects current best practice in Geography teaching.
- 2. Complete training courses relevant to the delivery of the Geography education.
- 3. Actively develop links or join external networks to share information and ideas.

# Administration/Contribution to the Community:

- Contribute to the School's outreach strategy.
- 2. Provide pastoral care for students within own area to ensure, as far as practicable, that relevant issues are dealt with in a timely, sympathetic and effective manner.
