JOB PURPOSE:

As SUMIT Community Research Fellow, the postholder will be co-located between QUB Communities and Place and the North Western demonstrator region (Derry/Londonderry / Letterkenny) working closely with staff in these organisations. They will provide a coordination, research and community outreach role within the regional SUMIT demonstrator site (coordinated by Developing Healthy Communities NI and Alcohol Forum Ireland). They will work at local level to ensure close collaboration with SUMIT activity leads/partners and relevant stakeholders in the region. They will ensure that all SUMIT data needs are met and are to the highest ethical standards. They will undertake data collection and anonymisation, data analysis, dissemination and community outreach activities, prepare progress and output reports on their work and ensure they are escalated to the appropriate staff for reporting and monitoring. This role will coordinate demonstrator project teams, assigning tasks for SUMIT administration staff, setting deadlines, and ensuring that the team is working efficiently, coordinating tasks relevant to all SUMIT activities at regional level.

MAJOR DUTIES:

- 1. Undertake data collection and anonymisation, data analysis, dissemination and community outreach activities for the SUMIT
- 2. Undertake research and development activities that may include fieldwork, critical evaluation, interpretation and preplanning, computer-based data analysis and re-evaluation in consultation with the supervisors, collaborators and other stakeholders.
- 3. Ensure all SUMIT data needs are met and are to the highest ethical standards and undertake secondary data research to inform data collection where necessary.
- 4. Coordinate the demonstrator project team, ensuring that the team are fully informed of SUMIT implementation activities and is updated on progress.
- 5. Assign tasks and set deadlines for the regional SUMIT administration support.
- 6. Track progress and implementation of SUMIT for the demonstrator region, ensuring that all issues are escalated to the SUMIT Programme Manager.
- 7. Read academic papers, journals and textbooks to keep abreast of the latest relevant developments.
- 8. Work closely with SUMIT Community Researchers in other regional sites and the QUB-based SUMIT Senior Community Research Fellow.
- 9. Identify and engage with relevant local stakeholders in the community and voluntary sector to promote and disseminate the SUMIT project.
- 10. Act as a liaison between SUMIT management board and individual team members when issues or concerns arise and ensuring that any risks are raised at the earliest opportunity to the SUMIT Programme Manager and provide reports on local level implementation.
- 11. Present regular reports to the SUMIT Project Implementation Board and other stakeholders.

- 2. Have or be about to obtain a PhD in a relevant subject.
- 3. Specific, relevant research experience working on a project that relates to health and social care services.
