## JOB PURPOSE:

To undertake research in the LIFELANGS Project. This position will contribute to the HEA North South Research Programme project LIFELANGS: Living Observatory of Shared Languages and Identities, reporting to co-PI Dr Aisling O'Boyle based in Queen's University Belfast. LIFELANGS is a joint project, with co-PI Professor Lorna Carson based in Trinity College Dublin. Close intra-institutional collaboration and cross-border mobility is a key feature of the project.

LIFELANGS employs a mixed method approach to study everyday phenomenon of language learning, language use, and the construction and (re)presentation of identities. In addition to four new Post-Doctoral Research Fellows, the project consortium comprises two Co-Pls, a team of eight academic Co-Leads drawn from TCD and QUB, and four PhD student researchers. The Post-Doctoral Research Fellow will report to and work directly with their Co-Pl. They will also collaborate with the full project consortium as well as external partners. The LIFELANGS Observatory Post-Doctoral Research Fellows will each work on an identified research stream. Each research stream will have an assigned PhD student researcher, co-supervised by the stream's Post-Doctoral Research Fellow.

### **MAJOR DUTIES:**

- 1. Actively participate as a member of the LIFELANGS research team including leading some of the project research activities in one of the four research streams.
- 2. Provide co-supervision and mentorship to the research stream's assigned doctoral student.
- 3. Collect, analyse, write up and disseminate results of research activity.
- 4. Contribute to the publication of research findings from the project.
- 5. Develop their own career and reputation.
- 6. Contribute to the research culture and agenda within the Living Observatory.
- 7. Under general guidance of the project's Co-Principal Investigators, define research objectives and proposals for own (or joint) research in line with the project's goals.
- 8. Assist the Co-PIs with project management and admin tasks.
- 9. Any other duties assigned commensurate to this level of post.

### **ESSENTIAL CRITERIA:**

- 1. A PhD in Education, Languages, Linguistics, Applied Linguistics, Identity Studies, Anthropology or cognate discipline (PhD must be awarded by start date of post).
- 2. Significant relevant experience in planning and delivering research projects or work packages to defined deadlines and standards.
- 3. Ability to conduct independent, high-quality research, evidenced by peer-reviewed publications, conference presentations, or equivalent outputs commensurate with career stage.
- 4. Proficiency in relevant qualitative and/or quantitative research methodologies, data analysis techniques, and research tools specific to the LIFELANGS project.
- 5. Strong academic writing and communication skills, including experience in drafting research papers, reports, or funding applications.

- 6. Experience of supervision/co-supervision/mentorship of students undertaking research.
- 7. Experience of communicating research to diverse audiences.
- 8. Ability to work independently with an agreed workplan.
- 9. Ability to work in partnership with colleagues as a team.
- 10. Contribute to the University's outreach programme by maintaining links with external community stakeholders.
- 11. Good understanding of the key issues and challenges associated with language focused work on the island of Ireland.
- 12. Good understanding of the opportunities and challenges associated with partnership working within a research environment.
- 13. Exhibits excellent interpersonal skills, including the ability to influence, negotiate, and engage constructively with diverse individuals and groups.
- 14. Ability to communicate complex information clearly, including the use of multiple methods of data visualisation.
- 15. Evidence of a high standard of report writing skills.
- 16. Ability to build contacts and participate in internal and external networks.
- 17. Demonstrable intellectual ability.
- 18. Ability to assess and organise resources.
- 19. Evidence of being able to work flexibly and to meet deadlines.
- 20. Willingness to work as part of a team.
- 21. Demonstrate flexibility and resilience in responding to challenges and adapting research approaches in dynamic or changing environments.
- 22. Willingness to travel.
- 23. Current valid driving licence and access to a car insured for business purposes.

### **DESIRABLE CRITERIA:**

- 1. Language proficiency qualifications, which evidence competence to read and interpret source materials, and collaborate across linguistic contexts.
- 2. Experience in planning and delivering language-focused research projects or work packages to defined deadlines and standards.
- 3. Experience of successfully organising language focused research, networking, and stakeholder events.
- 4. Experience of delivering high-quality research outcomes by setting clear objectives, planning effectively, executing tasks efficiently, and evaluating the impact of their work.
- 5. Experience of managing stakeholder advisory groups.
- 6. Works effectively within teams and contributes to a positive, collegial, and inclusive research environment.
- 7. Proactively builds relationships with teams and external partners.
